### COLLABORATION


AgriLife Extension partners with many external organizations, including thousands of trained volunteers, to deliver local programming.


Our agency is uniquely positioned to administer several technical services including soil analysis, water testing, pest identification, plant disease diagnosis, and wildlife damage management.

# Workforce


The total workforce of **1,826** full-time equivalent positions is comprised of **1,457** positions budgeted by the agency, and **369** county-funded personnel who work in county extension offices. The agency's cost for administration and shared administrative services is only **3.5%** of its total budgeted expense.

1,826 TOTAL FTES


